

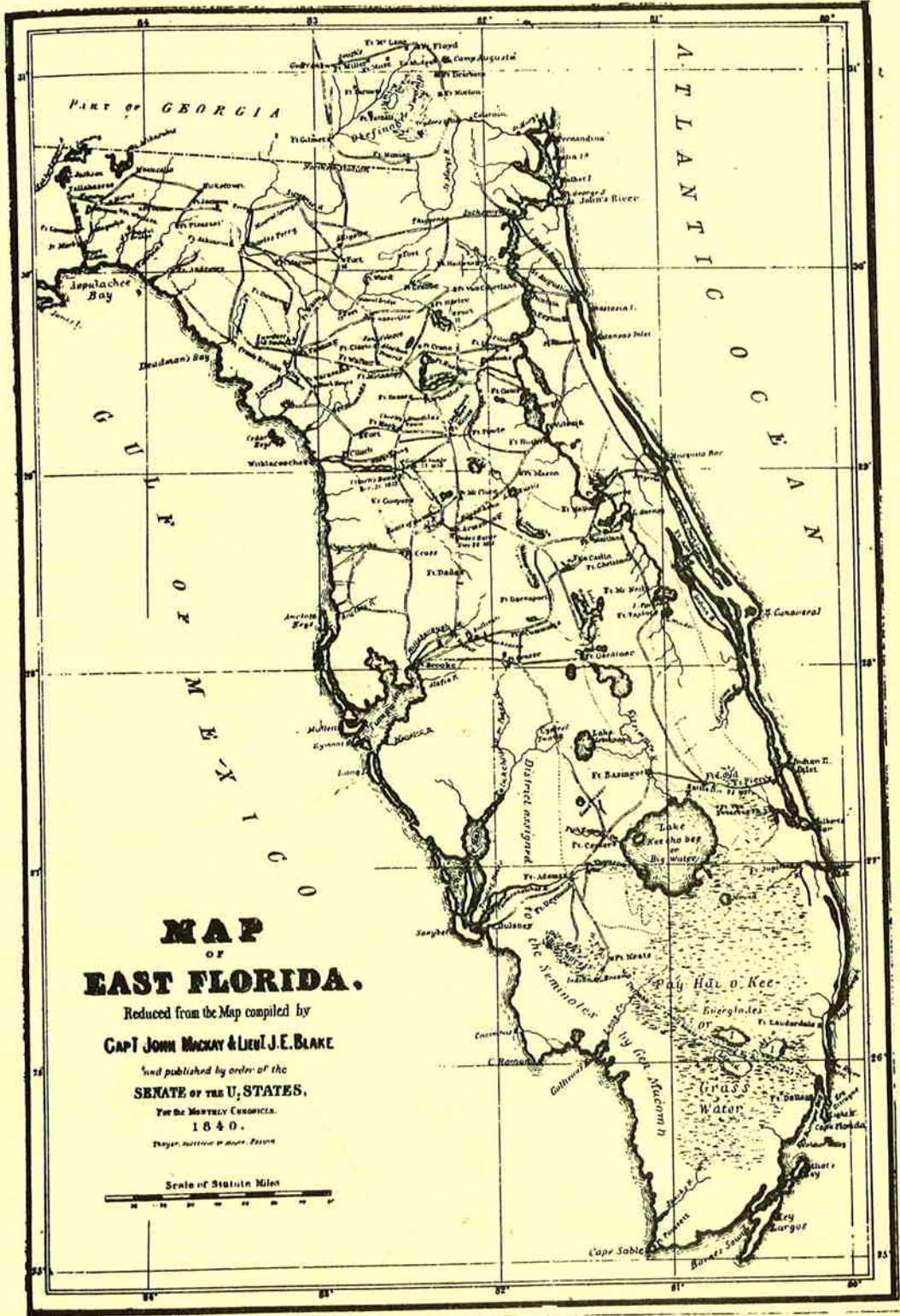

According to their 1895 affidavits, she was a first cousin of Franklin RAULERSON (born about 1821) who was living in Bartow, and she had been known "from childhood" by Rabon Noel RAULERSON. The 1870 & 1880 Federal Censuses for Manatee Co. indicate that she was born in Georgia about 1820.

ASA ASBURY LEWIS 1831-1862

Asa Asbury Lewis was born in 1831 in Twiggs County, Georgia, son  
 of James and Mahala (Storey) Lewis, who were natives of Orange County,  
 North Carolina. Several years after Asa Asbury Lewis was born, the  
 family moved to Lowndes County, Georgia.

Asa married Nancy Browning who was born in Lowndes County on  
 March 29, 1835, daughter of Joshua and Lydia (Godwin) Browning and grand-  
 daughter of Hardy Godwin. Their children:

1. Susan Mahala Lewis, born Sept. 28, 1858; died Sept. 12, 1936; married  
 John W. Gallagher. Buried in Bethlehem Cemetery near Dover, Fla.
2. William Henry Lewis, born Sept. 2, 1859; died July 8, 1940; married  
 Sarah Jane "Sally" Singletary. Buried in Evergreen Cem., Ft. Meade.

3. Harriet Lewis, born April 25, 1861; died Dec. 18, 1948; married Joseph Cooper Pearce. Buried at Hurrah Cemetery at Picnic, Fla.
4. Asa James Lewis, born Jan. 20, 1863; died June 29, 1942; married 1st, Isabelle Johnson; married 2nd, Mrs. Maude Cole Pender.

By 1860, the Lewis family had settled in Colquitt County, Georgia where they were farming. On May 11, 1862, Asa Asbury Lewis enlisted in the Confederate Army as a Private in Capt. Edmondson's Company C, 61st Regiment, Georgia Volunteer Infantry. He died at Staunton, Virginia on June 27, 1862. On Sept. 9, 1864, Mrs. Nancy Lewis widow of Asa Lewis received \$92.60 for her husband's service, from the Treasury Department of the Confederate States:

Prior to 1870, Mrs. Nancy Lewis & her four children along with her brother-in-law, Matthew Lewis, his wife & children & mother-in-law, Sarah Wincey, moved to south Florida by wagon and oxen, bringing their livestock and worldly goods. Family friends, the Yates, who had previously moved to Florida, had written and urged the Lewis' to join them in this wonderful country. The families all settled along the Alafia River in the Picnic area, farming and raising livestock.

Nancy B. Lewis died on Dec. 28, 1913 and was buried in Bethlehem Cemetery near Dover, Florida.

ABSTRACTS FROM THE "PUNTA GORDA HERALD"

This material was abstracted and contributed by Mr. Vernon Peeples of 523 SE North Shore Drive, Punta Gorda, Fla. 33950. The date preceding the information is the date of issue of the newspaper.

May 17, 1895 C. W. CONOLLY died on the 9th. He had been a resident of Florida for many years and came to this city seven years ago. He leaves a wife and five children.

Mar. 10, 1899 Mrs. MATTIE G. HARVEY wife of K. B. HARVEY died in Mobile, Ala. on Sat. She was at the home of her sister, Mrs. E. B. KIRKBRIDE. Mrs. HARVEY was reared in Mobile. She was 37 years old on the 22nd of October. She came to Punta Gorda nearly 12 years ago with her first husband, SUMNER P. HINCKLEY and his parents and sister, Mr. & Mrs. B. HINCKLEY and Miss BESSIE OTIS HINCKLEY. She leaves three children, MINNIE, a girl of 13 years, KIRKBRIDE, a lad of eight years, children of her first husband and MARINA, 18 months old, child of Mr. HARVEY.

Oct. 4, 1901 JIM HARRIS, a well known colored citizen died Saturday. Mr. JAMES JONES, late of Nocatee, had a son born on the Keys where he is camped for the winter. JOHN J. PEARCE 1808-1878

Preface: Have you ever lived by a family or have you ever known one in the family that you felt was neglected. This is sort of the way I feel about John J. Pearce. For a long time I found out very little about him, but I was always finding materials written about his brother, Levi Pearce. As I tried to find more about him, I became even more distressed. It seems that he had no boys, only girls. It is so difficult to find a family especially when you have to do it through another name. As this man's history began to fall in place, there was just no one to keep his memory alive. Even his middle initial is not certain. I found the name John Jonathan Pearce once, and I am always leery about one item being used as evidence or proof of something. Since there are so many "Johns" in the Pearce family, I use the letter "J" to help identify him and it is very likely that he could have been named after his Uncle Jonathan Cain. (Mrs. Pasteur is editor of The Pearce Family Newsletter).

John J. Pearce was born during the year 1808 in Georgia. He was the son of John and Ann (Cain) Pearce. Nothing is known of his childhood. If you used your imagination, you could say he was "reared" on a farm. He had two brothers, James and Levi, that were Methodist ministers. On Dec. 1, 1831 in Camden County, Georgia John J. Pearce married Mary Mizell daughter of David and Nancy Mizell and sister to James C. Pearce's wife, Elizabeth. Their children:

1. Elizabeth Pearce, born June 5, 1838; married Bertrand Bledsoe in Hillsborough County on 23 Feb. 1860.
2. Sarah Ann Pearce, born 1841; married Burzilla Wood in Hills. Co. on Jan. 20, 1867.

3. Nancy C. Pearce, born 1843; married James B. Colson in Hills. Co. on Aug. 30, 1874.
4. Mary Pearce, born 1850; married Abe Colson.
5. Fanny Cornelia Pearce, born July 2, 1852; died April 21, 1897; married Manor L. Blount. Both buried at Pleasant Grove Cemetery in Hills. Co.

Prior to 1850, John J. Pearce, Levi Pearce and other relatives had settled in Hillsborough County in south Florida. In the 1850 census they were living in the Alafia area. John applied for bounty land on Dec. 6, 1850 in Hillsborough County. When Mrs. Mary (Mizell) Pearce applied for a pension when she was 81 years old, she stated that John was a Sergeant in the company commanded by Capt. E. E. Mizell, James Neiblack and others. He enlisted at Fort Lancaster, Fla., served from 1835 to 1837 and was given an honorable discharge in Newnansville, Fla. She gave a description of him at the time of enlistment as follows: age about 26, occupation of farmer, height about 6 feet, dark hair, blue eyes and light complexion. She further stated that she was married to John Pearce in the county of Camden on the 1st day of Dec. 1830 A.D. (other records show 1831) by one George W. Thomas who was Clerk of the Court. She also stated that her husband died in Hillsborough County on Oct. 7, 1878. He was buried in Pleasant Grove Cemetery.

JAMES ALDERMAN 1801-1880

James Alderman, a son of David and Jemima (Hall) Alderman, was born in Duplin County, North Carolina, Feb. 19, 1801. He and his twin brother, Timothy, were the youngest in a family of fourteen children.

In 1815 James went with his parents to Bulloch County, Georgia. It was there that he married Roxie Ann Holloway, daughter of William and Orpha Holloway. Roxie Ann was born in Bulloch County, Feb. 16, 1808. They had the following children:

1. Matthew Alderman, born 1827; died 1870; married 1st, Caroline Sloan; married 2nd, Elizabeth Hendry.
2. Jency Alderman, born 1829; died 1850; married Charles W. Hendry.

6. Elizabeth A. Alderman, born April 9, 1835; died Sept. 26, 1881; married William F. Morrison, Jan. 15, 1851.
7. Michael Alderman, born 1836; died 1866; married Mary Jane Burnette.

In 1827 James and his family moved to south Georgia, settling in Thomas County, where they appear on the 1830 and 1840 censuses. While a resident of Thomas County, James Alderman served as Justice of the Peace in the 637th District from 1829 to 1833.

About 1850 James Alderman decided to take his family to the frontier area of south Florida, and settle in Hillsborough County, along the Alafia River. Deed records of Hillsborough County show that on Jan. 16, 1851 he paid John Parker \$200 for 160 acres of land located as follows: the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 14, Township 30S, Range 21E. Also recorded is a Letter of Patent from Millard Fillmore, President of the U. S. to James Alderman for 40 acres located as follows: the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 13, Township 30S, Range 21E, dated May 18, 1852. During the 1850's and the 1860's James Alderman was engaged in the cattle business. Hillsborough County tax rolls show that in 1853 he owned 500 head and by 1855 he owned 900 head of cattle. On July 19, 1851 he registered the 4 brand and on July 12, 1853 he registered 22, according to Hillsborough County's oldest Marks & Brands Book. On March 16, 1863 James registered the 4 brand in Manatee County.

During one of the Seminole Indian uprisings, James and his family were forced up north of the river at Alafia for protection. James decided to move to the south side of the river, although many of the people in the fort did not think it safe because of reports of Indians being nearby. Nevertheless, he went across the river and settled. One night, the horses, who were extremely sensitive to Indian sounds, began to stam-pede. The next morning the Aldermans returned to Fort Alafia. When the hostilities ended, James Alderman returned to his home and is generally recognized to be the first person to settle in the area south of the

Alafia River. Alderman's Ford, located near his homestead, is the spot where James first crossed the river. During the Third Seminole War, in 1856, James Alderman served in the volunteer militia

company of Capt. Leroy G. Lesley. On July 9, 1855, James applied for bounty land based upon service in Capt. Newman's company during the Seminole War in 1836 in Thomas County, Ga. The claim was rejected for lack of proof. (Above signature from 1855 application).

On November 24, 1860, the people of Hillsborough County met at Alafia and recommended that the State of Florida secede from the Union. James Alderman was among the citizens who signed the petition urging secession. The 1860 census shows James Alderman and family residing in Hillsborough County with James having real estate valued at \$1500 and personal property worth \$10,100. Nearby neighbors included sons Matthew, Mitchell, Timothy and Michael Alderman and sons-in-law, M. P. Lyons and William B. Moody.

According to her tombstone in Pelot's Cemetery, Hillsborough County, Roxie Ann (Annie) Alderman died March 6, 1868. Another source gives her death date as March 5, 1882. At any rate, James Alderman appears on the 1870 census for Hillsborough County in the Hurrah Community.

The following item appeared in the Tampa Sunland Tribune, dated Feb. 19, 1880:

Died on the 3rd instant, at the residence of Mr. Josh Riggs in Manatee County, Mr. James Alderman, aged 79 years. Mr. Alderman was one of the oldest settlers in this county and was an upright and honest man.

James Alderman's body was interred at Pelot's Cemetery near the Alafia River.

JAMES EDWARD HENDRY 1808-1852

James Edward Hendry was born on Sept. 29, 1808 in Liberty Co., Georgia, son of William & Nancy (McFail) Hendry, grandson of Robert & Ann (Lee) Hendry and James & Judith McFail. James moved with his parents to Lowndes County (now Brooks) and grew up on his father's plantation about eight miles southeast of Pavo, Georgia. In 1829, James married Lydia Carlton. She was born in Sampson Co., N. C. on April 4, 1812 daughter of Judge John Carlton and Nancy Ann Alderman. Their children:

6. Eli Hendry, born Feb. 1, 1840; died young.

In a family record written by George W. Hendry in 1900, he described his father: "James E. Hendry was a quiet, sedate man; seldom laughed, but indicated his pleasure with a pleasant smile. He was retiring in his habits; his words were few but well chosen. He never sought or held office. His doors were always open to the traveler, especially to ministers of the Gospel, but no one was ever turned away hungry or empty handed. He had many reverses in early life by standing security for others, yet he accumulated seven or eight thousand dollars' worth of property, beginning with nothing and dying in his forty third year. He was always, and by all men, noted for his honesty. It was proverbial where ever he was known; he was never accused of a dishonest act, his every act being on the Golden Rule. He was a praying man and trusted in God; humbled and condescending to men of low estate."

After their marriage, the Hendrys settled in Thomas County. G. W. Hendry wrote: "My father's main residence was 18 miles above Thomasville, on the old hack line to Albany, and was, in 1859, called "Youngville", as one Jinks Young bought my father's place upon his removal to Florida. All
