ISSUED A PROTEST

AGAINST THREATS OF DEPORTATION COMMITTEE—CIGAR MAKERS OUT WITH A MANIFESTO YESTERDAY, OF WHICH THAT FORMED THE CHIEF COMPLAINT.

A manifesto was issued this afternoon by cigar makers alleged to represent 22 cigar factories. The manifesto is in poster form and is quite lengthy, amounting to about four columns of ordinary length. The translation into English was evidently made by a novice; but by careful study what was intended to be said can be approximately determined. It accuses the Tampa Daily Times for constantly threatening the cigar makers with a visitation of a deportation committee. It further claims that while the cigar manufacturers have nominally carried out their agreement that prices should remain the same as before the strike, that although the length of the cigar has not been increased, yet the thickness of the "Violas" has been so increased and the degree of workmanship so raised that where a working man before the strike could make 250 cigars per day at an average price of \$17, or \$3.80 per day, now under the present conditions the average number of cigars made per day is 150, which at the same rate per thousand reduces the average daily wages to \$2.50.

An effort to interview the manufacturers this afternoon proved futile as all the office forces were busy making out payrolls and making the weekly payments to the operatives.

Leading citizens stated that cigar makers have for the past two years, since the strike, secured a higher property than at any time since the factories have been in operation in Tampa, and are better prepared to pay their bills promptly.

They have had constant work, even when the orders for cigars were scarce on the files of several factories, and they have been undisturbed by strikes and lockouts and an era of unprecedented prosperity has characterized the general cigar trade in which the workmen have reaped the same benefits as the factories.

One fact pointed out in the manifesto which shows the wonderful growth of the cigar industry in this city during the last two years, is that there are today about one thousand more cigar makers at work here than before the strike. This increase, with an average of five to each family, gives an increase in citizens of 5,000 people.

Such a marked development is not to be lightly trifled with, and the conditions which have brought about such a desirable result. The increase in other lines have kept pace with this department which would easily double that figure or give us 10,000 new citizens, who, of themselves, would constitute quite a city. A like increase for the next ten years would give us a city of 100,000 inhabitants.

PROMINENT MAN DEAD

Quintana's restaurant, corner of Seventh avenue and Fifteenth street.

ORDINANCE NO. 322.

An Ordinance authorizing the City Council of the City of Tampa, by and on behalf of the City, to enter into a contract with the Decarie Manufacturing Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Minnesota, to construct and install a complete incinerating plant in the City of Tampa.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Tampa:

Section I. That the City Council of the City of Tampa be and it is hereby authorized, ordered and directed to enter into the following contract and agreement with the Decarie Manufacturing Company, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, the said contract being in the words and figures following, to-wit: "This Contract and Agreement, made and entered into on the 8th day of November, A. D. 1903, between the Decarie Manufacturing Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and the City of Tampa, party of the second part."

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of money hereinafter specified to be paid to it as hereinafter provided, and stipulated by the said City of Tampa, hereby binds itself to construct and install a complete incinerating plant, including building, approaches, etc., as per specifications and plans on file with the City Clerk of the City of Tampa, marked Exhibits "a" and "b" respectively to the proposal of the said Decarie Manufacturing Company, and both of which form a part of this contract together with the following:

Construction. The construction of the incinerating plant and building to be as per specifications and plans on file with the City Clerk of the City of Tampa, subject to slight changes, and to comply with and meet requirements as set forth in letter of the Chief of Sanitation of the City of Tampa, dated October 3rd, 1903, asking for bids for said plant.

Operation. The party of the first part to furnish an expert for thirty (30) days, Sundays excepted, to teach the employees of the City how to handle the plant so as to obtain the best and most economical results therefrom.

Capacity. The incinerating capacity to be as per requirements named in said letter of October 3rd, 1903, to-wit, not less than twenty-five (25) tons of garbage within twenty (20) hours.

The said plant to be installed complete at the earliest possible date (one hundred and twenty (120) working days, or sooner, if possible), starting work immediately after contract is duly signed and executed.

Guarantee. The said party of the first part guarantees that all material entering into the construction of said plant shall be of the best quality for the purpose used, and all workmanship shall be first class, and it also agrees to replace any part or parts of the cost to the City of Tampa, which may prove defective in material or workmanship.

Cost of Incineration. The party of the first part guarantees that the said plant will incinerate in a satisfactory manner, without combustible refuse and rubbish with night soil mixed therewith, at a cost not exceeding fifty (50) cents per ton (two thousand (2,000) pounds), based on capacity requirements and price of fuel, costs as given in said letter of October 3rd, 1903.

Acceptance. The said plant to be tested immediately after final completion and in the presence of proper officials; if same meets requirements and fulfills guarantees as to construction and cost of incineration as set forth in this contract, through the proper officials is to promptly accept the same and pay to the Decarie Manufacturing Company amount as per terms of contract.

Steam and Water Plant Equipment. The party of the first part also agrees to construct and equip and furnish material therefor, in connection with the said plant, a complete steam and water plant with steam pump and a ten thousand (10,000) gallon water tank, upon a tower thirty (30) feet high, also an artesian well one hundred and thirty-five (135) feet deep, with proper fittings and connections.

Price of Fittings and Items. The price of complete plant as above set forth, with steel stack secured by guy wires, shall be fifteen thousand and seven hundred (\$15,700.00) dollars, payable as follows, to-wit: That the sum of one hundred and forty (\$1,400.00) dollars payable upon completion of building and approaches and delivery at Tampa of incinerating plant; two thousand and ninety-three dollars and thirty-four cents (\$2,093.34) payable upon completion, test and acceptance of plant; five thousand two hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents (\$5,233.33), with interest from completion and acceptance of plant at the rate of six (6) per cent, per annum on or before December 10, 1904, and five thousand two hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents (\$5,233.33) with interest from completion and acceptance of plant at the rate of six per cent, per annum on or before the 10th day of December, 1905.

Location. The ground to be furnished by the City of Tampa, as specified in said letter of October 3rd, 1903, and the City of Tampa is to furnish all necessary permits and concessions to enable the said party of the first part to carry out the terms of this contract.

Delay. In case of delay in completing the plant beyond time mentioned in this contract, if such delay is caused by accident, fire, strike, or for reasons beyond the control of the said party of the first part, the city shall not impose damages upon the said party of the first part for the incinerating plant, but shall be considered valid cause for litigation against the said party of the first part or for non-acceptance of said plant.

The party of the second part hereby contracts with the said party of the first part for the incinerating plant as above set forth, and does hereby bind above set forth, and does hereby bind to pay to the said party of the first

part, or its authorized agents or assigns, the several sums of money above set forth, at the time and in the manner as above set forth.

Section II. That the sum of five thousand two hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-four cents (\$5,233.34), be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Reserve Fund of the City of Tampa for the purpose of meeting the first two payments provided for in the foregoing contract, and if shall be unlawful for the said Reserve Fund, or any part thereof, to be expended for any other purpose, unless there be in said Reserve Fund an amount in excess of said sum of five thousand two hundred and thirty-three dollars and thirty-four cents (\$5,233.34) and it shall be the duty of the City Council to make provision for the last two payments above mentioned (which are the deferred payments) at the time of making up their annual budget in each year in which said payments fall due. However, in the event the City of Tampa should issue bonds for public improvements and should include therein a sufficient amount to meet the cost of the incinerating plant above set forth, and the

said bonds should be sold and the money realized thereon before the maturity of either or any of the foregoing payments, then and in that event the Decarie Manufacturing Company shall be paid out of the moneys so provided by bonds for the construction of said plant.

Section III. The contract set forth in Section I shall be binding upon the parties thereto and shall be of full force and effect immediately upon the passage and publication of this ordinance. Providing, within six (6) days thereafter the said Decarie Manufacturing Company shall file its acceptance with the terms thereof with the City Clerk.

Section IV. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed. Passed this 6th day of November, A. D. 1903. (Signed)
